Captains Williamson, Young, and Reynolds of the 49ers met Captains Dorsett, Donovan, Dickerson, Breunig, and R. White at midfield. Dallas won the toss (heads) and elected to receive; S.F. chose to defend the North goal. Kickoff came at 2:01 pm PST officially. Wersching kicked off out of bounds. SF penalized 5 yards for illegal procedure. Wersching's kickoff from the SF30 was taken by Newsome at the D7 and returned to the D26 where he was stopped by McColl and Williamson. (19 yard kickoff return)

BILL WALSH: "We overcame alot of adversity and questionable calls. We're very proud of our entire organization, especially the players. There's one game left to play, and it should be a great game! It should be a great Superbowl.

The difference today was the execution on offense. Dallas was very resourceful. (On the game winning drive) We tried to methodically cut them apart."

TOM LANDRY: " The 49ers did a great job of driving downfield (on game winning drive), and we just couldn't get any pressure on Montana. It was just a rollout to the right and Joe was great at putting the ball up high and Clark was there.

e've had a great year. The 49ers aren't a better team than us, but the game ended at the right time for them. Montana has to be the key. There's nothing else there except him.

49ers Locker Room

More Bill Walsh -- (On winning drive) "We tried to methodically cut them apart. We were able to do that because we have a resourceful quarterback. (Re his feelings at this moment) There isn't any feeling yet, it's been too hectic. The defense played great all year. Got to give credit to Dallas. They're a great team."

BOBBY LEOPOLD -- "Nothing compares to this win. This is the highest point of my career. (On special teams play) They moved me to the outside because Dallas likes to run a lot of reverses. Today they just came my way. (On his INT): We were in man to man coverage, Harper got a hand on the ball and I managed to hang on. You gotta give credit to Harper for jamming the receiver."

CRAIG PUKI -- "The chance to be a world champion is something to hang your hat on. I'm still in shock about today's game. I'm going to do a little celebrating tonight. We proved our worth as a team today."

LAWRENCE PILLERS -- (On White's fumble) "We were in a four man rush. The center pulled out and I pulled on his jersey and went for the quarterback. It wasn't my best hit of the season, but it certainly was my most important one."

DWAINE BOARD -- "I was drafted by Pittsburgh and then I was cut. That was in their Super Bowl year of '79. This Super Bowl coming up means more to me than that one would have. Fred Dean's pass rush makes my job easier. We got a couple of bum calls against the secondary today."

FRED DEAN -- "We proved today we can make things happen. We came from behind, that's what it takes to make the Super Bowl. We knew we had to stop them on their final drive and we did. It feels great. We deserved it. The action on the field today spoke louder than their (Dallas') words during the week."

RONNIE LOTT -- "If anybody on the team deserves to catch the winning touchdown pass, it was Clark. (Re: Pass INT call on INT) My concentration was on the ball all the way."

ARCHIE REESE -- "We went after them. We knew we had to go out there and be aggressive. We tried to come off the ball fast. We had trouble against the shotgun, but hey, we won. It's a sign of a champion to be able to overcome mistakes. Hey, it turned out pretty good today, didn't it?"

LYNN THOMAS -- "From 6-10 to the SUPER BOWL! Nothing could be finer than to be a 49er!"

DWIGHT HICKS -- (On TD pass to Cosbie): "The tight end got out faster than we had wanted him to. This has to be a thrill for the rookies. I can't explain anything that has ever been more gratifying than this, because as you know I've had my ups and downs in my career!"

JIM STUCKEY -- "I made the recovery (of White's fumble)...Yeah!!! This victory today made my career. Give credit to Pillers. He made the play. I held on tight to that football. I wasn't about to give it up. At that moment I felt total euphoria. We forced turnovers to win games throughout the year."

CARLTON WILLIAMSON -- "Without a doubt it was my biggest thrill. Who beats Dallas twice and moves 89 yards when it counts the most. The 49ers!!

ERIC WRIGHT -- "The difference between me & Ronnie is I still make little mistakes. I wish the Super Bowl were next week. I stripped Cosbie (in the endzone) and that was a big thrill."

KEENA TURNER -- "I got the chicken pox. I felt a little woozy at times out there today, but nothing was going to keep me from playing. Without a doubt this was my biggest thrill."

MORE 49ers...

OFFENSE....

KEITH FAHNHORST -- "Joe was something else. On that last drive, we were a little worried. But we knew that Joe can take care of himself. He just makes things happen. That last drive will go down in history. 90 yards against the Cowboys., and winning the game. During the huddle in the last drive we were confident. We had no doubt that we could move the ball. We knew we could score. Joe's mobility gives us a lot of options that we haven't had before. Again..he just makes things happen. (Re; Lenvil): When they activated Lenvil we knew that he would be able to help us in the playoffs. He is the type that can contribute. I couldn't be happier to see him get the ball when it counted. On our blocking patterns during the last scoring play we had to hook our men. I came off of the big pile and just saw Clark making the catch. It was just wonderful."

RANDY CROSS -- "It's unbelievable, just unbelievable. They didn't get to Montana when they had to. Joe's funny. He scrambles to mess up the coverages. He just rolls out and completes the pass. This game was my superbowl. In the final drive our first thought was just to get first downs. We worked for 30 odd weeks and the season boiled down to getting the last 50 yards when we reached midfield. You really have to credit Lenvil Elliott. With him, we got our 'bob' back (sweep play). We need our old backs like Hofer & Elliot to make that play work. Earlier this seson John Ayers and I were talking, We were saying to each other that we wplud develop into champions. I just didn't know that it would come this fast."

DWIGHT CLARK -- "It was a split out right. Both Freddie and I go down into the end zone and slide back on the end line. The two defensive backs that were one me were watching Joe. When he scrambled out I just slid down the end line and got a step on them. Dallas has a great offense. They have a great team. It was just a great game. When the ball went up it was just a matter of me going up and getting it. Joe put it in a place where it was either going to be caught by me or be incomplete. There was no chance of an interception.."

JOE MONTANA -- "It's hard to say how this experience compares to those big games at Notre Dame. During Dallas' last drive when they made that big play (for 31 yards) I got a little nervous. But our defense like it has all season shut them down when it counted and got the turnover. On our last drive, it was typical of the whole season. It was a matter of us scoring when we had to. Dallas was much more different today. They were much more physical...like the Dallas team of old. It hasn't quite sunk in that we're going to the Super Bowl. During the huddle on our last drive we had the confidence that we could move the ball. We felt that we definitely had a shot at it with over 4 minutes remaining. The scoring play was the same one on which Freddie Solomon scored on. When I released the ball I KNEW it was high but I was pretty certain that Clark could get it. It wasn't until I saw the replay that I noticed that it was much higher than I had thought. We didn't concentrate on anything different during that last drive. In situations like those I don't fear it. I don't welcome them, but if it's there, I'll take it. D.C. is just a disciplined receiver. He's always where he is supposed to be. We always work on adjusting patterns during the week."

LENVIL ELLIOTT -- "I'm just glad for my teammates. Both the ones here and in Cincinnati. It couldn't happen to better people. During the last drive when they called me for the sweep play, it just felt good to get the responsibility. We knew that Dallas would be in a defense that would not give up 6 points since a field goal wouldn't hurt them. My main thought on those sweeps were to hang on to the ball and to get as many yards as I can."

EDDIE J. DEBARTOLO, JR. -- (Re; Coach Walsh): "I had heard through the grapevine that he was an offensive genius. But it was through my personal interviews with him that I was convinced that he was the man that could bring us all the way. He is a very intense person, and also very loyal. He's a great man."

FREDDIE SOLOMON -- "Dallas played me like a deep threat. Right now I haven't had time to think about the Super Bowl. I'm sure I'll be excited tomorrow when it all sinks in."

WILLIE HARPER -- (on Dallas' last drive): "All I thought about was 'interceptiton, interception, interception'. Dallas has one of the greatest two minute offenses in football. Pillers made the play and that was the end of it."

CHARLIE WATERS: "Defensively, we should have stopped them on their last drive. We stopped them pretty good most of the game, but that last drive for some reason was unstoppable. (On Clark's TD catch) We had double coverage on him and nobody else was double covered. He made a spectacular catch. I know because I had a great view. Montana was just buying time until Clark got open. It had to be a perfect throw and a perfect catch."

EVERSON WALLS: "Losing big would have hurt us alot as far as our respect in the league is concerned, but the close score indicates that we played like champions. I made some good plays, but I didn't make the big play. Clark works well with Montana; he's 6'4" and has great physical ability. On his TD play, Downs and I were double covering Clark, but I had the outside coverage and Micheal Downs had the inside coverage; I just didn't come up with the big play when we needed it most. But Dallas is a great team, not was."

HARVEY MARTIN: (When asked if this was the worst Dallas loss) "Yes, this was the worst".

TGO TALL JONES: (On the last touchdown) "I don't know what happened, I thought I had a good rush. I guess it was just a gutsy play by Montana. I actually thought he put it up for grabs".

DANNY WHITE: "We came out here today very optimistic. I think if we could have just gotten 15 more yards on the last drive we could have been in field goal range and we could have won it. The 49ers made the big plays when they had to. We felt we had the best team in the league, so this is difficult to take. The Eagle loss in the playoffs last year was not nearly as hard to take as this one. The 49ers put great pressure on us today. We never really established a passing attack".

TONY HILL: "We just weren't calling the wide out receivers numbers today. I think Coach Landry wanted to play more of a ball control game. In a situation like this, you let the Headcoach determine the type of plays to call. I don't feel the 49ers are the caliber of the Cowboys -- but they won. If we played them again tomorrow, I think we would beat them. I just think we could have exploited their defense more.

RON SPRINGS: "It really hurts to lose like this. I'd rather get blown out. We didn't respect the 49ers when we played them earlier in the year, but we did today. Both teams had chances to win. I think the Bengals and 49ers do alot of things alike. The Superbowl will be a tossup but I think San Francisco will win".

DOUG COSBIE: "I'm very disappointed, but in a month or so, I'll start thinking about next year. We were just a few minutes away from the Superbowl. If there had been 3 or 4 minutes left on the clock, I think we could have won.

TONY DORSETT: "I was almost TK'ed when I got poked in the eye, but I got my vision back, and that's the important thing. My eye was sore, but I played the whole second and it didn't bother me enough to hinder me. I thought the field was in pretty good shape, considering it was Candlestick Park. I've got to go with the NFC in the Superbowl"
