Subject: Language Arts, History, Technology

Lesson Title: The Story of Pro Football

Goals/Objectives:

- Students will:
 - Read information to build understanding and to acquire new information.
 - Conduct research by gathering data.
 - Demonstrate knowledge of language structure and conventions.
 - Adjust their use of written language to communicate effectively with a variety of audiences and for different purposes.
 - Use technology to create a final written product.

Methods/Procedures:

Prior to Program

- Students will continue their research on the Hall of Fame by finding information on the Hall of Fame's selection process

- Student should be able to answer questions like:
 - Why was the Hall of Fame built?
 - Why was Canton, Ohio selected to be the home of the Pro Football Hall of Fame?
 - How has the museum expanded over the years?
 - Who is the current President?
 - Who are some of the past Presidents?
 - What is the selection process to be Enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame?
 - Can you name some members of the selection committee?
 - Can you name some past finalists who have not been Enshrined yet into the Hall of Fame?
 - Who has been a finalist the most?

During the Program

- Students will:
 - Take notes about the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
 - Learn about the Mission/Vision/Values of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
 - Learn the historical reasons why the Pro Football Hall of Fame is located in Canton, Ohio.
 - Discuss details on how the Hall of Fame has expanded over the years.
 - Learn more details about the Hall of Fame's selection process.
 - Complete the History of the Hall of Fame and Selection Process worksheet provided (pages 4-5). Students can use this information during their post-program activity.

After the Program

- Students can write a letter for an eligible player, coach or contributor stating why they feel this person should be Enshrined into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- Students should demonstrate in that letter an understanding of the history of the Hall of Fame and the legacy of those Enshrined.
- Students can use qualitative and/or quantitative information to support their case as to why their selected person should be in the Hall of Fame.
- Students can submit their chosen player, coach or contributor who has been connected with pro football simply by writing to the Pro Football Hall of Fame. The only restriction is that a player and coach must have been retired at least five years before he can be considered. There is no mandatory retirement period for a



contributor before he may be considered. Every nomination of an eligible candidate received will be processed and forwarded to the Hall of Fame's Selection Committee.
