Quarterback Steve Young entered the National Football League through the 1984 supplemental draft. After spending two seasons in the ill-fated United States Football League, the consensus All-America from Brigham Young was selected by the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in first round of the special draft.

In 1987, Young was traded to the San Francisco 49ers where he served as the backup to Hall of Famer Joe Montana. After seeing limited action in his first four seasons with the 49ers, Young stepped into the starting role in 1991 after Montana suffered an injury. Young wasted little time in taking command of the 49ers offense. Despite a knee injury that forced him

out of five games that season, Young passed for 2,517 yards and 17 touchdowns to post a league high 101.8 passer rating - the first of four straight passing titles. Young added two more passing titles in 1996 and 1997 to tie him with the legendary Sammy Baugh as the only

quarterbacks in history to win six NFL passing crowns.

His finest season came in 1994 when he posted a then-record 112.8 passer rating by completing 324 of 461 passes for 3,969 yards and 35 touchdowns. Young also added seven rushing touchdowns as he guided the 49ers to a NFC West title with a 13-3 record. The team then coasted through the post-season. In the NFC championship game that year, Young threw two touchdowns and rushed for one as the 49ers downed the Dallas Cowboys 38-28. He topped off the year with an incredible performance in San Francisco's 49-26 win over the San Diego Chargers in Super Bowl XXIX. Young passed for 325 yards and threw a Super Bowl record six touchdowns. He also was the game's leading rusher with 49 yards on five carries. For his efforts, he was named the Super Bowl Most Valuable Player.

During his NFL career, the left-hander threw for 3,000 or more yards six times and had 20 or more touchdown passes in a season five times, and posted a passer rating of 100 or higher six times. Aside from his passing ability, Young was a constant threat as a runner. He ran for 4,239 yards and scored 43 rushing touchdowns.

Young, one of the most accurate passers in league history, was named All-Pro in 1992, 1993, 1994, and 1998 and earned All-NFC honors three times. The two-time league MVP also was selected to the Pro Bowl seven times.

CAREER: Combining toughness, athleticism, character, and leadership Steve Young established himself as one of greatest quarterbacks in NFL history...In fact, with career quarterback rating of 97.6, he stands as most accurate passer in the history of NFL...Is only player in league history to have quarterback rating of more than 100 six times...Matched Sammy Baugh's NFL RECORD with sixth NFL PASSING TITLE with rating of 104.7 in 1997...He is NFL'S ALL-TIME LEADER in touchdown-interception ratio (2.16), topping Joe Montana(1.96)...One of few NFL quarterbacks who was able to dominate games with his arm and his legs...After taking over as San Francisco's starting signal caller in 1991, threw 178 touchdown passes and rushed for 33scores...Owns career record of 94-49 (.657) as starting quarterback...Was 91-33 (.734) record as starter for 49ers, topping Joe Montana (.719, 100-39) for highest winning percentage in team history...Named to seven consecutive PRO BOWLS (1992-98), second longest streak in TEAM HISTORY behind Jerry Rice (11)...Earned NFL MVP honors in both 1992 and '94, in addition to being named SUPER BOWL XXIX MVP...Holds TEAM CAREER RECORDS with 66.1 completion percentage, longest pass play (97t), average gain per pass attempt (8.22)and 102.4 QB rating and 5.9rushing average...Also ranks third with 2,400 completions,3,648 attempts, 221touch-downs and 29,970yards...Has recorded 28 300-yard passing games...Holds NFL RECORD for most consecutive 300 yards games with six in 1998, breaking Joe Montana's record of five in1982...Ranks 19th in NFL history with 33,124 career passing yards and 16th with 2,667career completions...Second on NFL's all-time quarterback rushing list with 4,182 yards, trailing only Randall Cunningham (4,741)...His 43 rushing touchdowns are most by quarterback in PRO FOOTBALL HISTORY, breaking Jack Kemp's previous mark (40)...Ranked seventh on 49ers career rushing list with3,581 yards...Played one season (1984) for L.A. Express of USFL and two seasons (1985-86) with Tampa Bay Buccaneers prior to being traded to San Francisco in 1987.

1999: Started and played in three games before suffering season-ending concussion at Arizona (9-27)...Completed 45-of-84 passes (53.6%) for 446 yards and three touchdowns...Rushed 11 times for 57 yards...Missed last 13 games with concussion suffered at Arizona (9-27)...Completed nine-of-26 passes for 96 yards at Jacksonville (9-12)...Also rushed five times for 25 yards at Jaguar...Completed 23-of-35 passes for258 yards and two
