This Gallery is where all of the Hall of Famers are honored with their Bronze Bust. Currently in the Gallery there are 354 Bronze Busts, signifying that 354 individuals are enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. To put that in perspective, there have been over 300 million people who have played the game of football, 5 million who have played in college and only 29,000 people to be paid to either play, coach, officiate or administer to the Game of Pro Football.
