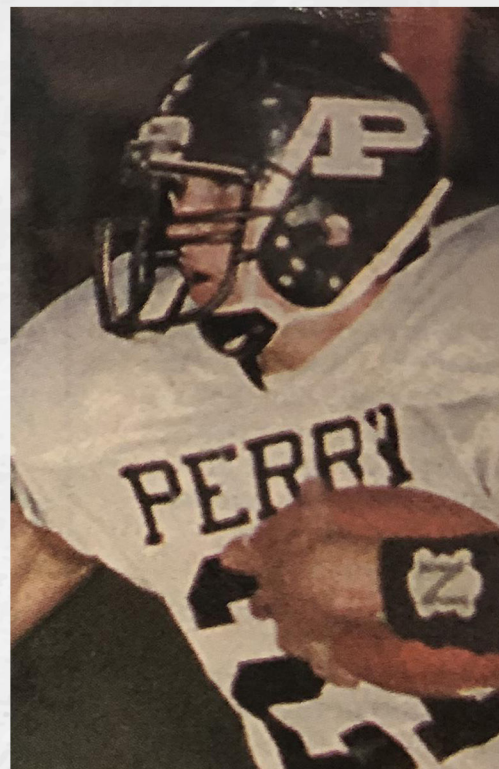


WELCOME CLASS OF 2022

LANCE BURICK

PERRY | 1994-96 | RUNNING BACK-LINEBACKER

- Born March 22, 1978.
- Selected Stark County Player of the Year in 1996.
- Rushed for 1,065 and 10 touchdowns and recorded 88 tackles as a senior.
- Helped lead Perry to Federal League titles in 1994 and 1995.
- Compiled a 20-10 record in three seasons with the Panthers.
- Known as a tough, hard-nosed running back and dominant linebacker.
- Elected to the Perry Athletics Hall of Fame in 2009.



ERIC HEINZER

PERRY | 1998-2000 | RUNNING BACK-LINEBACKER

- Stark County Player of the Year in 2000.
- Federal League Player of the Year in 2000.
- First-team Division I All-Ohio running back in 2000.
- Helped Perry beat both Massillon and McKinley for the first time in program history in 1999 Division I playoffs.
- Rushed for 1,784 yards and 26 TDs, along with making 120 tackles, as a senior.
- Led Panthers to 12-2 record and first regional championship in 2000.
- Elected to the Perry Athletics Hall of Fame in 2012.

LARRY LARSUEL

MASSILLON | 1962-64 | GUARD-DEFENSIVE TACKLE

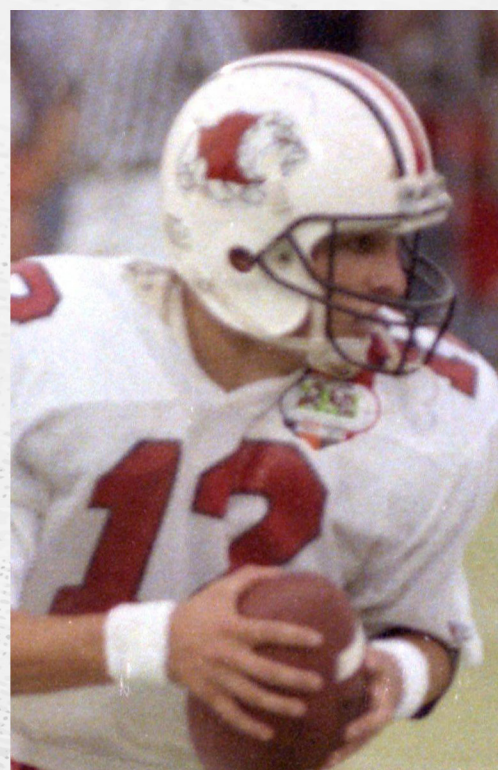
- Born July 30, 1947.
- Died Nov. 8, 2016.
- Second team All-Ohio offensive guard in 1963.
- First team All-Ohio defensive tackle in 1964.
- Helped Massillon post a 25-6 record over his three seasons.
- Quiet two-way leader for the Tigers along both lines of scrimmage.
- Helped Tigers win 1964 AP state championship.



JOSH McDANIELS

CANTON MCKINLEY | 1992-94 | QUARTERBACK-KICKER

- Born April 22, 1976, in Barberton.
- Started at QB and kicked for the Bulldogs from 1992-94, reaching state playoffs in 1993 and 1994.
- Second-team Division I All-Ohio QB as a senior in 1994.
- Helped Bulldogs win a Division I regional title in '94, as seven of their 10 wins featured fourth-quarter comebacks where he passed, ran or kicked the winning score.
- His 1,538 passing yards set a school record, and now rank sixth.
- Remains ranked among the McKinley leaders in several kicking categories.
- Played football at John Carroll University, where he graduated from in 1999.
- Coached in the NFL since 2001, winning six Super Bowls as a top assistant coach with the New England Patriots (2001-08, 2012-2021) — spending the last nine years there as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.
- Head coach of the Denver Broncos, 2009-10, compiling an 11-17 record.
- Enters 2022 as head coach of the Las Vegas Raiders.
- Joins his father, Thom, and brother, Ben, in the Stark County High School Football Hall of Fame.

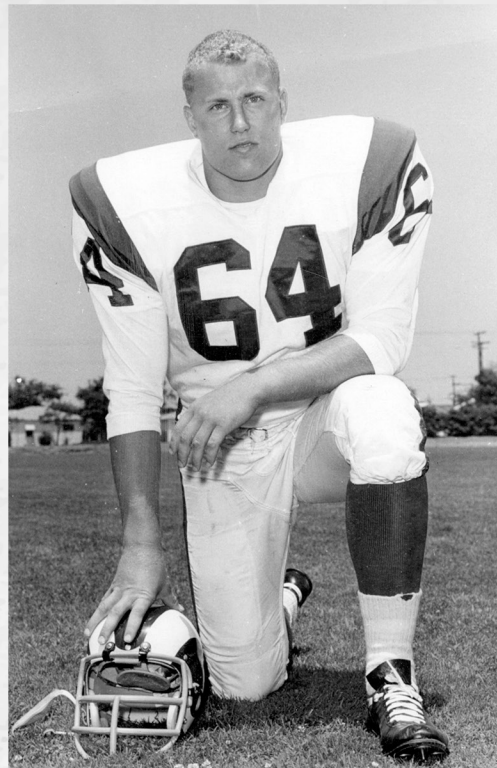

TIM POWELL

HOOVER | 1957-59 | TIGHT END-LINEBACKER

- Born Sept. 2, 1942.
- Second Team Repository All-Stark County twice.
- WHBC All-Stark County and Honorable Mention All-Ohio as a senior.
- Played in 1960 Ohio North-South All-Star Game with likes of Paul Warfield and Roger Staubach.
- Also played post in basketball and was a pitcher/first baseman in baseball for Hoover.
- Two-way lineman (guard and defensive tackle) for Ara Parseghian at Northwestern, lettering twice.
- Helped Wildcats beat Ohio State two consecutive years and rise to the No. 1 ranking for two weeks in 1962.
- Played in 1963 North-South College All-Star Football Game in Miami.
- Played for Canton Bulldogs of United Football League in 1964, helping them to league championship.
- NFL All-Rookie Team in 1965 for Los Angeles Rams.
- Played on defensive line behind "Fearsome Foursome" of Deacon Jones, Merlin Olsen, Lamar Lundy and Rosey Grier.
- Played with Pittsburgh Steelers for his second and final NFL season.
- Member of inaugural North Canton Athletic Hall of Fame class in 2014.
- Sons Scott and Chris both were all-county QBs for Hoover, with Scott going on to play at Ohio State.
- Retired from Day Ketterer law firm in 2012.
- Longtime youth football coach in North Canton.



HERMAN "BUP" REARICK

CANTON MCKINLEY | 1942-49 | HEAD COACH

- Born March 11, 1909, in Dover.
- Died Nov. 9, 1965, in Canton.
- Three-sport athlete at Dover High School, where in the 1926-27 school year he was a senior captain on an undefeated football team and state-championship basketball team.
- Played three sports in college at Wittenberg.
- Hired in March of 1931, as a math teacher, head football coach and head basketball coach at Dover High School.
- Compiled a football coaching record of 118-21-10 in stops at Dover (1933-37) and McKinley (1942-49).
- Compiled a basketball coaching record of 428-130 at Dover and McKinley, including a state championship in 1933 at Dover.
- Reached the state basketball finals at McKinley in 1940, 1943 and 1956 and the state semifinals in 1945 and 1954.
- Believed to be the only man elected to the Ohio High School Football Coaches Hall of Fame and Ohio High School Basketball Coaches Hall of Fame.

ZACH SLATES

PERRY | 2000-02 | OFFENSIVE GUARD-DEFENSIVE TACKLE

- Born Aug. 16, 1984.
- Three-year starter for Perry teams that went combined 29-7.
- Helped Panthers to first state semifinal appearance in program history.
- Three-time first-team Canton Repository All-Stark County.
- Three-time first-team All-Federal League.
- Two-time first-team All-Ohio.
- State qualifier in wrestling and thrower in track and field.
- Played in Big 33 and Ohio North-South All-Star games.
- Played football at University of Pittsburgh for one season.
- Assistant coach for Perry 2010-2020; named head coach in 2021.
- Special education teacher at Perry.
