Subject: Language Arts, History, Technology

Lesson Title: Hall of Fame Virtual Scavenger Hunt

Goals/Objectives:

- Students will:
 - Read information to build understanding of texts and to acquire new information.
 - Adjust their use of written language to communicate effectively with a variety of audiences and for different purposes.
 - Conduct research by gathering data.
 - Demonstrate knowledge of language structure and conventions.
 - Use technology to create a final written product.

Methods/Procedures:

Prior to Program

During the Virtual Scavenger Hunt

- Students will:
 - View the virtual scavenger hunt video.
 - Answer the questions during the program.
 - Use the provided worksheet to answer and record the answers to those questions asked during the video.

After the Program

- Students will
 - Use the information gathered from the pre-virtual scavenger research and from the virtual scavenger hunt to prepare for a final project.
 - Complete a final project telling the story of pro football and how the Hall of Fame brings these stories to life through their exhibits.
 - Begin final project by typing an outline highlighting facts they learned. Students can use the Hall of Fame’s website to gather more facts about the museum if needed.
 - Need to organize those facts by themes (could be by subject, by decade, by gallery, etc.) to help create a smooth flow for the final presentation. Length will be determined by the teacher and time allotted to complete the final presentation.
 - Use any type of visual presentation platform (Show board, PowerPoint, Prezi) to present this information to their class.
- Teacher can decide the time limit for each student’s presentation, number of graphics required, number of facts needed, etc.
