Subject: Geography, History and Technology **Lesson Title:** The History of Your Favorite NFL Franchise

Goals/Objectives:

 Students will understand the relationship between a team's history, geography and its NFL nickname.

Methods/Procedures:

Prior to Program

- Students will:
 - Research your favorite team's history, nickname and Hall of Famers:

 - Answer the following questions:
 - What year did the franchise begin?
 - How did they get their nickname?
 - What are some highlights to the team's history?
 - Who are some Hall of Famers from your favorite team?
- Based on your research come up with some questions to be asked during the program.

During the Program

- Students will:
 - Learn about the Mission/Vision/Values of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
 - Learn more about the NFL team history, nickname and Hall of Famers
 - Examine team histories and how many teams are deeply woven into their city's history.



- o Discover how their favorite team serves their community and region.
- Complete the "The History of Your Favorite NFL Team" worksheet provided (pages 4-5). Students can use this information during their post-program activity.

After the Program

- Students will:
 - Compile all the information they gathered from the pre-program research and during the interaction with the Hall of Fame.
 - Will use additional research
 - o Draft this information into an outline form.
 - Complete a persuasive research paper about their favorite NFL team including information about their early years, team nickname, Hall of Famers and how they are involved with the community.
 - Demonstrate why the team has been an important part of the community.
 - Create a presentation using a Show board, PowerPoint, Prezi or something similar.
 - Present their project using their chosen presentation medium.
