

- Demonstrate an understanding of how good character is essential for achieving success in life.
- Be inspired to live a more meaningful and effective life by incorporating new insights regarding good character into their daily lives.
- Learn what it means to be a good teammate in their community and in their world.
- Learn how to give back and serve their community.

Personalized Learning

Universal Design for Learning

- State the objective verbally while also providing a handout so students fully understand what they are going to learn and what to do for this lesson.
- On the Objective handout students will have a self-check for pre/post-learning.

Accommodations / Modifications

- Have paper copies of what the students must do for the activities.
- Allow both typing and writing for the final assessment as students may prefer one over the other.

During the Program (HOF)

Time Allotted: 50 minutes

Materials/Resources

- Computer

Activities

- (10 minutes) Welcome/Mission/Values
- (30 minutes) Discussion/Presentation and Videos on Walter Payton Man of the Year
- (10 minutes) Question and Answer

Assessment

- Discuss the Mission/Values of the Pro Football Hall of Fame
- Discuss what they learned about Walter Payton and his legacy.
- Share who they selected and one thing they learned about that person.
- Learn about how the game of football teaches how to commit yourself to something bigger than just yourself.
- Learn that teams not only exist on the field but more importantly in the world.
- Learn how to give back and serve their community.

This is the lesson component the instructor will complete with students back at their classroom after the field trip program.

After the Program (5-12 School)

Time Allotted: 30 minutes for summary sheet. The instructor decides how much time for the assessment

Materials/Resources

- Essay assignment materials: computer, pencil, and paper.

Activities

- Students can take what they have learned from the pre-program research and the actual program and write or type an essay on what they learned from this experience and then what can they do to make their community a better place.

Assessment

Student's will be assessed based on their final project/ essay.
